# "The Good News"

As I read and listen to experts talk about best practices for a healthy life, I repeatedly hear about Gratitude. Gratitude is a high value for people of faith, for as we stay in touch for what we are grateful for in our lives, we are better able to thank God and categorize these gratitudes as blessings. Ritually, when we prepare for Holy Communion, we recall with gratitude what God has done through our spiritual ancestors, from liberation of slavery in Egypt, to the gift of our savior Jesus Christ. A strong sense of gratitude is what keeps us balanced as we face difficult days.

Some people find it helpful to make regular gratitude lists to give them a balanced perspective in their lives. Some may practice this on a daily basis, writing down, or praying about 10 things they are grateful for.

I would like to list 12 reasons why I am grateful today. The 12 represent our paid staff at Good Shepherd, who, collectively, have given us 129 years of ministry in the name of Jesus. (Interestingly, I notice that it has been exactly 129 years since our building was formally dedicated!)

Our Custodian Bonnie Kennedy has been with us for 27 years, giving us her dependable and skillful ministry of hospitality. Our Administrative Assistants Diane Baum (who also serves as our Treasurer) and Jessie Livingston prove themselves invaluable for the many ways they support our staff and congregation. Rachel Conover has fashioned a strong youth ministry that keeps our young people involved in church and growing as disciples.

Our music ministry brings such beauty and strength to our worship experience: Cheryl Todd as our organist and Handbell director, Jonathan Tatar as our vocal choir director, Sue Gilla as our choir accompanist, Jon Conover as our Reborn praise band leader, along with talented and faithful band members Tom Hartnett, Elaine Green, and Peyton Elliot. Finally, I include myself as pastor, for I am grateful to be here, and grateful to serve with such talented and committed ministry partners.

And of course, I am grateful for you and the ways you have heard and responded to God's call in your life. Let us serve together in this newish year with grateful hearts.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

January, 2025

Here's the Church financial results for 2024. After a great month of March, contributions were generally flat until the last couple months. It's a pleasure to report that, with great contributions in both November and December, contributions for the year ended up only about 1.5% below the record level of 2023. Thanks to all for their generous contributions and outstanding support of the Church!

From an expense standpoint, normal operating and administrative costs, payroll expenses, and apportionment were, in total, about 3.2% higher than the levels that we had in 2023. All of these expense increases were the result of the continuing expansion in various Church programs, coupled with a very significant inflationary impact in many operating expense categories. The adjustments to work schedules and responsibilities made by all staff members continues to allow proper accommodation of all the changes in worship schedules, building use, and revised work requirements. The trustees and other church committees continued their exceptional dedication to controlling their expense obligations. The results of their efforts were outstanding! We are fortunate to have so many great, dedicated people associated with our Church! By the end of October, we had used up all of the excess funds carried over from 2023 to stay current with our obligations. With the strong contributions received in November and December, we concluded the year with all expenses, including conference apportionment, paid in full. We also had excess general fund contributions of about \$25,000. Finance voted to tithe 10% of this excess to our Mission Team for them to redistribute to worthy missions of their choice. The remaining excess will roll back into the Church's dedicated general funds to cover bills in the New Year.

What can we expect in 2025? Our 2025 budget forecasts an increase in total expenses resulting from pay increases being provided to staff, along with continued inflationary increases in some specific operating and administrative expenses. Our anticipation is that income from contributions will be sufficient to offset these increased expenses. The number of responses to November's annual request to provide 2025 Estimates of Giving is a slightly behind those received last year. Having these estimates provides significant help in our ability to properly manage church finances. If you have not yet sent one in, it can still be done by contacting the church office. With two Sunday morning services, Sunday School and Adult Christian Education sandwiched between them, along with Sunday gathering room and fellowship hall hospitality, we continue to see more people in church! On-line worship is still available and an ever increasing number of other church programs are also available. This provides many ways to become more personally involved with the Church. The contributions that you are making on a regular basis through the mail, by using other e-giving methods, and in person at worship services are needed and very much appreciated! Please prayerfully consider continuing, or even increasing them as personal finances allow. With everyone's help, your Church will continue to stay up to date with all of its expenses, have funds available to make improvements, continue to retain our valuable staff, and continue to bring the Lord's message to everyone.




